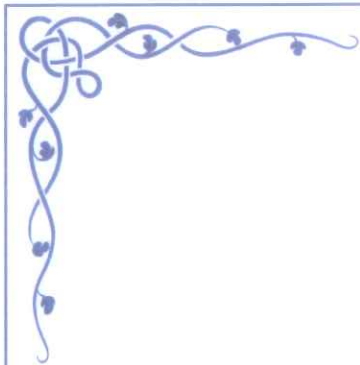

For a world of lost sinners was slain

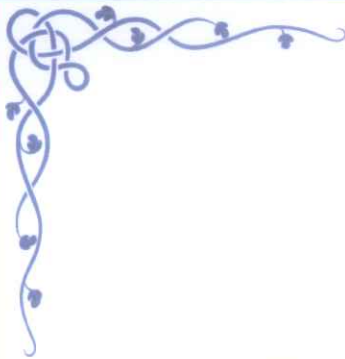
So I'll cherish the old rugged cross
