THE PASSING OF A FOOTBALLER

We kick off side by side in a minute Cheered by old family, teammates and friends Football's really a blast in heaven After your first whistle the matches never end The details of my career served with pride for 63 years Neville Briggs – D.O.B. 17/08/1930.

- 1. In 1941 I represented my school team as goal keeper for 3 years, leaving school at the age of 14 years
- 2. I played with the local side Edwinstowe United for 2 years Worksop League
- 3. At 16 years old I joined Ollerton Colliery (at that time playing in the Midland League also represented the Central Alliance League v League Winners)
- 4. Played a number of games for Leicester City A team and then was called up for National Service in 1948 for 2 years, I represented the Royal Corp of Signals also selected for the Northern Command side.
- 5. Owing to a knee injury my playing career was curtailed.
- In 1951 I joined up with Tom Johnson the Manager of Rotherham United, involved with youth development and scouting, and latterly became Chief Scout, working under 3 other Managers – Danny Williams, Jack Mansell & Tommy Doherty.
- 7. I left Rotherham United in 1968 to re-join up with Tommy Docherty the Manager at Aston Villa, where I held the position of Chief Scout until 1981 (I had then worked under 3 Managers. (Tommy Doherty Vic Crowe and Ron Saunders) over a period of 9 years
- 8. In 1977/8 I joined Sheffield United as Chief Scout at the behest of Jimmy Sirrell and then for Harry Haslam.
- 9. I then joined Stoke City FC as Chief Scout with both Alan Durban and Richie Barker until 1983.
- 10. From there I worked part time with Jim Smith at QPR until 1988
- 11. Then 1988 I went with Jim Smith to Newcastle United, where I worked for 10 years under the management of Ossie Ardiles Kevin Keegan, Kenny Dalglish & Ruud Guillit.
- 12. Whilst at Newcastle I was also Assistants Manager/Coach to Notts FA and at that time we won the County Youth Cup.1991/2.
- 13.1998 I joined Kevin Keegan at Fulham FC and whilst there I worked under Paul Bracewell, Jean Tigana and Chris Coleman.
- 14. In 2005 due to ill health and a stroke the consultant advised that I retire from the game, having served 63 wonderful years and met some phenomenal people on my journey.
