Priest: Let us pray. [*Brief silent prayer for Dan.*]

Lord our God, the death of our brother Dan recalls our human condition and the brevity of our lives on earth. But for those who believe in your love, death is not the end, nor does it destroy the bonds that you forge in our lives. We share the faith of your Son's disciples and the hope of the children of God. Bring the light of Jesus Christ's resurrection to this time of testing and pain as we pray for Dan and for those who love him, through Christ our Lord.

All: Thanks be to God

Acclamation – said by all:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Jesus said: "I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even if he dies he will live." Alleluia!

The Gospel

Priest: The Lord be with you.

All: And with your spirit.

Priest: A Reading from the holy Gospel according to John. [John 11: 17-21.]

All: Glory to you, Lord.

At the end of the Reading:

Priest: The Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The Mystery of faith:

After the Priest's prayer:

Recessional Music: *After all these years* by Foster & Allen.

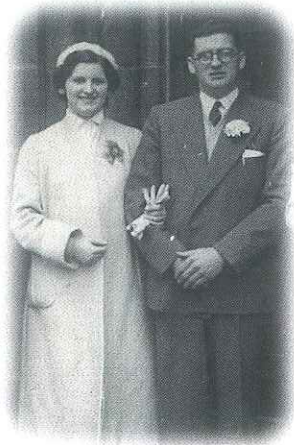
