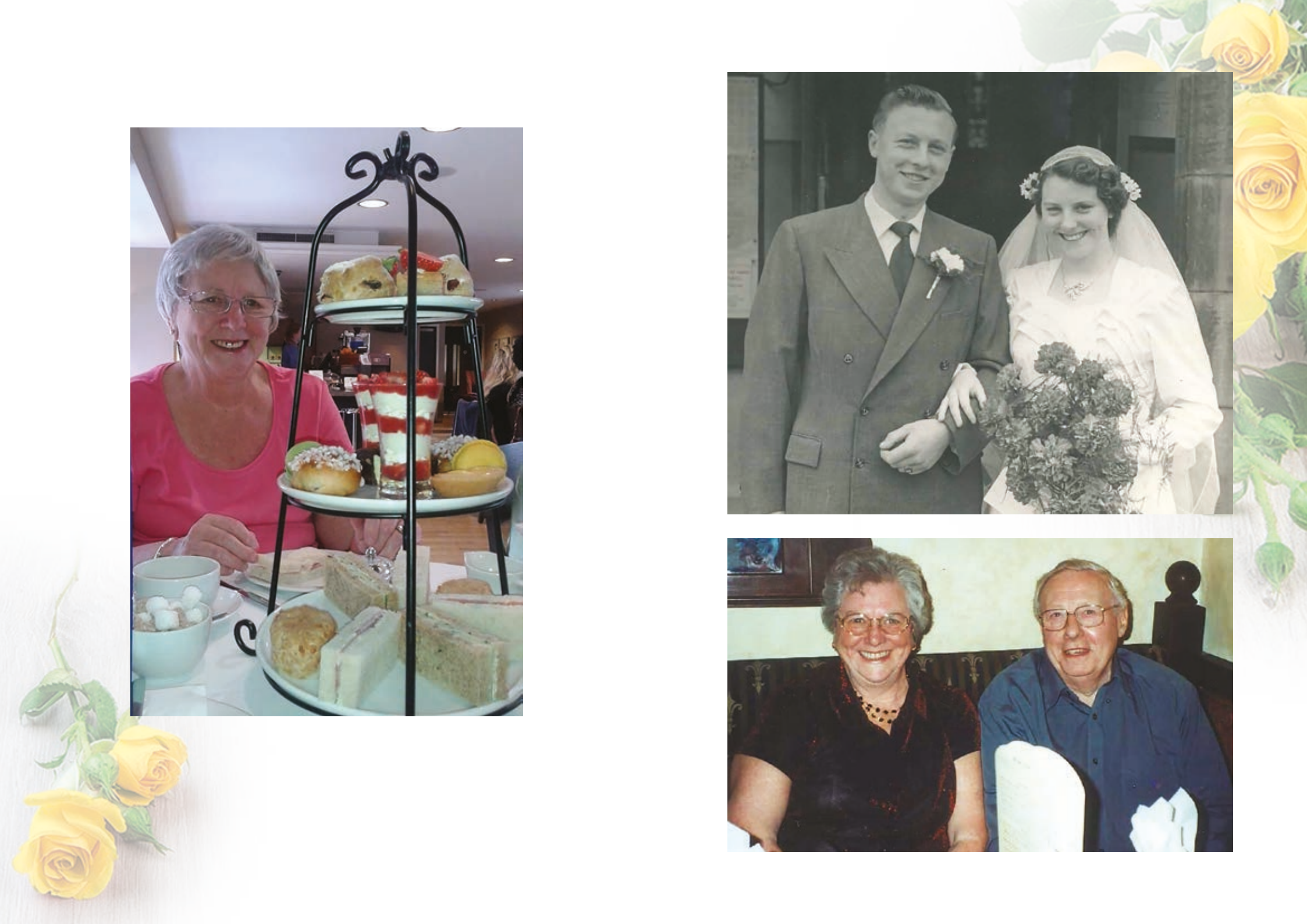

If I have all the eloquence of men or of angels, but speak without love,
I am simply a gong booming or a cymbal clashing. If I have the gift of
prophecy, understanding all the mysteries there are, and knowing everything,
and if I have faith in all its fullness, to move mountains, but without love,
then I am nothing at all. If I give away all that I possess, piece by piece,
and if I even let them take my body to burn it, but am without love,
it will do me no good whatever.

Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous, love is never boastful or
conceited, it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offence
and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins
but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust,
to hope and to endure whatever comes.

Love never ends as for prophecies, they will pass away: as for tongues, they
will cease: as for knowledge, it will pass away. For our knowledge is imperfect
and our prophecy is imperfect; but when the perfect comes, the imperfect will
