

Edgar joined Clifton Cricket Club in 1948, when it reconvened after World War II. Throughout his time with the club he has been Captain, Chairman and, for the past thirteen years, the President.

Edgar is married to Mabel, the sister of former Presidents Frank (Sam) and Harold Elliott.

An extremely stylish all-rounder, Edgar played twice for Nottinghamshire Cricket Association in the 1950's. Playing in an era before 'manicured' outfields and pitches. Edgar's tally of over 6000 runs came at twice the rate of nearly all his team-mates, and his abilities to hit 50s at a time when a team score of 100 was nigh unbeatable was second to none.

With over 420 wickets at less than 10 runs a piece. He played his last game in 1979, however, Edgar stakes a claim to be one of the finest cricketers to ever play for the village; and no doubt would walk into an all-time Clifton Amateur 11.

Edgar was chairman of the club for 16 years, but more recently has suffered from failing eyesight which has curtailed his visits to the ground. That aside, the Club are honoured to have him as President for the 13th year.

1948 - 2018 Edgar was the oldest surving playing member when elected as President.



Thank you for joining us today to say goodbye to Edgar and to help us celebrate his long and happy life.

I know Edgar would have appreciated the efforts you have made to be with us today, so on his behalf, thank you very much.

I would also like to thank you for all your support and kind wishes.
