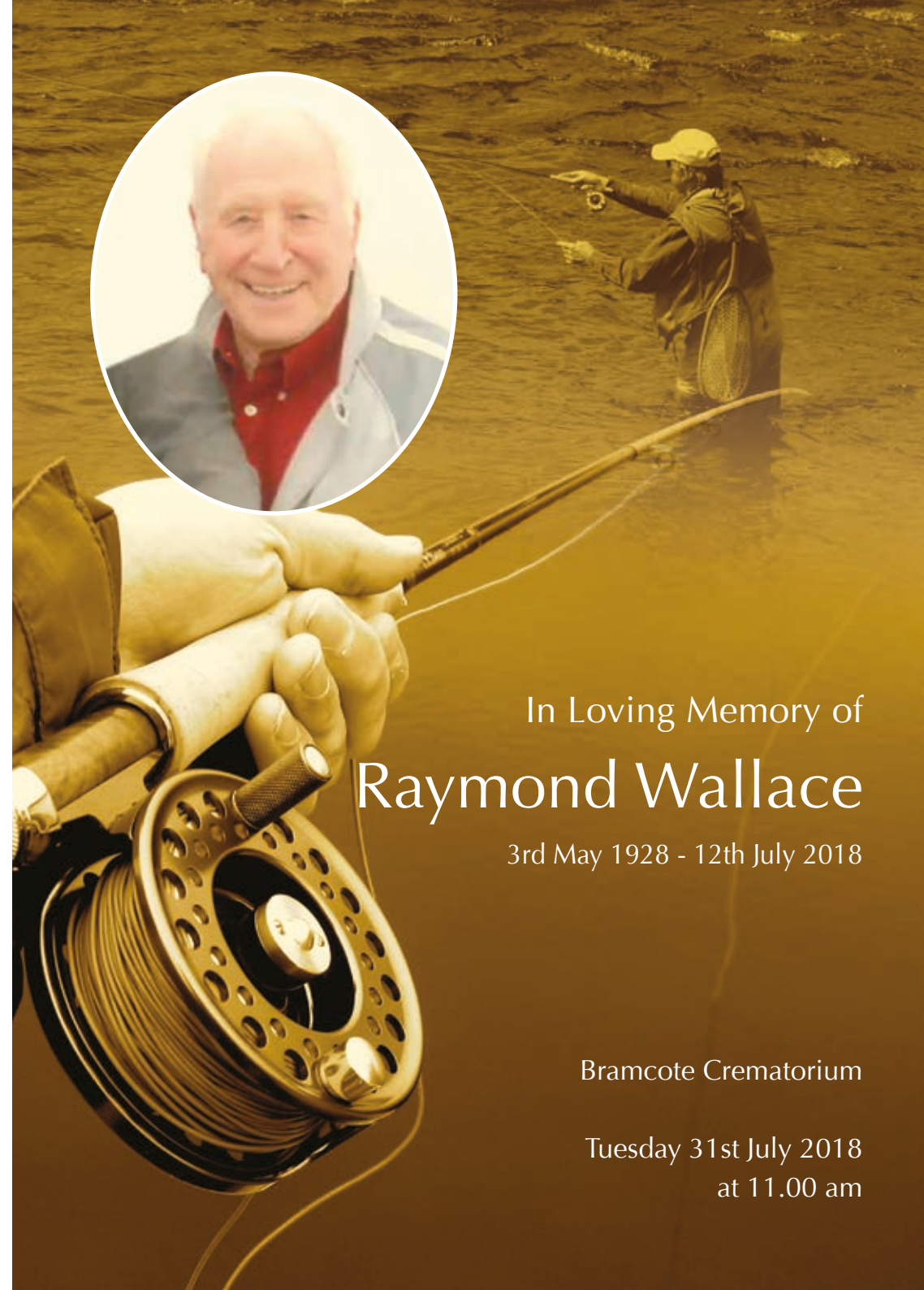

for ever and ever. Amen.


