on earth as it is in heaven.

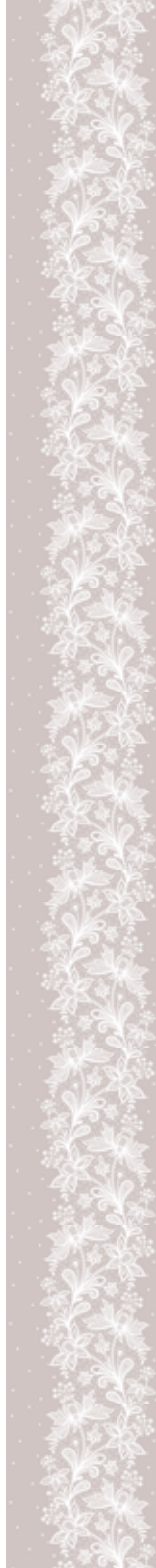
Give us this day our daily bread.
