But, Jesus, draw Thou nearer, and shield my soul from sin.

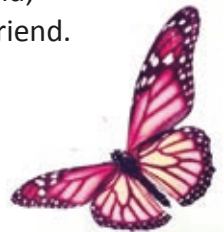
O let me hear Thee speaking in accents clear and still,
