God's Garden

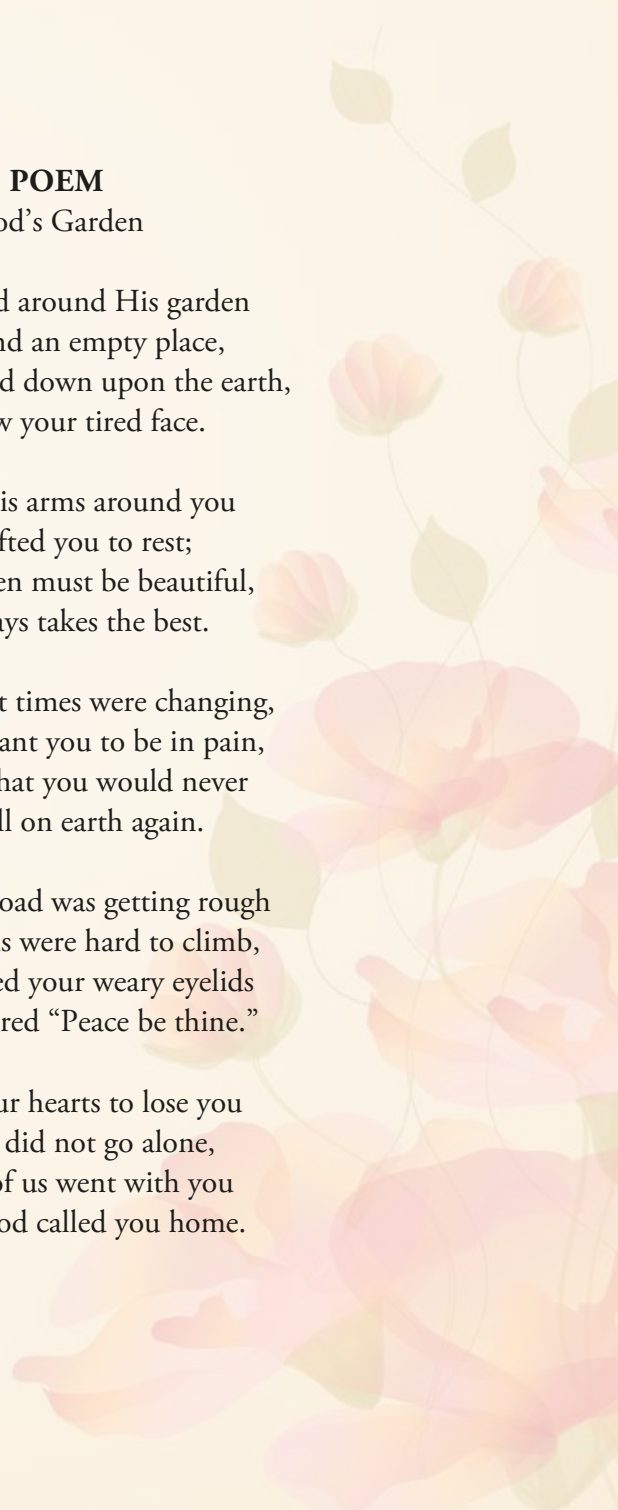
God looked around His garden
