REMEMBERING OUR DEAR FRIEND ROBYN...

We first met Robyn in the early 90s when she moved into our village, Durrington, and joined us in the 4th year at Upper Avon School (as it was known then). Whether she wanted to do it or did it to please us, Robyn was quickly coerced into all the activities we enjoyed: dancing around to Take That and joining the school musical – this solidified our friendship.

During these teenage years we shared many hilarious and special moments. We fondly remember fun sleepovers at each other's houses, where there'd be very little sleep and a whole lot of talking, inevitably about which boy we fancied at school! We also enjoyed getting together after school to sing and dance to our favourite songs from our favourite boy band. During long summer holidays, we would take walks down to the river and hang out there for hours on end, giggling and laughing with each other, making treasured memories without realising it.

Our friendship flourished and deepened over the years as we supported each other through difficult times and shared many seminal moments; finding our first loves, exams, driving tests, leaving school, first jobs. Despite busy lives in adulthood, we would often meet up to mark special occasions such as weddings, milestone birthdays and the birth of our children. But we also met for regular 'girls' get-togethers', circulating weekends at each other's houses. Invariably these trips ended with us dancing around someone's kitchen, usually to Take That, reminiscing about school days and laughing until we cried.

Laughter is one of the things we'll remember most. Robyn was wickedly funny with a dry sense of humour. She once told our teacher that her real name was Robena, not Robyn, and was called that for the rest of the term!

We will always remember Robyn as fun-loving and kind-hearted – she offered unconditional, loving friendship to everyone she met. It is heart-warming to know that our friendship was as important to her as it was to us, reaffirmed by the discovery of an old newspaper clipping found in her diary about that very same musical we talked her into joining.

We will miss our friend dearly.
